The impact of Moyes on women's fiction through the characters is not limited; it is a reflection of the entire female empowerment and solidarity theme. "The Giver of Stars," a 2019 novel by Moyes that traces back to the historical Pack Horse Library Project of Depression-era Kentucky, very straightforwardly announces women's agency and community as its main themes. The story tells about a group of women who, apart from delivering books to remote Appalachian communities, break barriers of expected gender roles and create friendships which are strong enough to help them in hardships. This work has been described by some critics as an epic feminist adventure that not only reveals the powerful impact of literature but also the toughness of women who still encounter patriarchal conditions.⁸ The theme of women's empowerment that has been prominent since the beginning of Moyes' writing career, is the one that connects her with the literary tradition of women's fiction that depicts romantic stories as a means to explore issues of gender politics and social inequality.

Her writing has been said to be very simple and direct, and very unselfconscious, at times even to the point of letting the story take its natural course without any kind of artificial ornamentation but still introducing such details and dialogues that the character and the setting are very vividly depicted. This mix of being readable yet assumed to be a work of art has worked in favor of the writer, as it has allowed her to be popular with the public at the same time keeping her artistic integrity. Besides, her successful switch to screenwriting, for instance, her adaptation of "Me Before You" for the big screen, is an indication of her versatility and a deep-rooted understanding of storytelling across different formats of the media.

The acknowledgment of Moyes' literary accomplishments by the institutions goes on to prove her participation in modern English literature. She is still one of the very few authors who have been awarded the Romantic Novel of the Year Award by the Romantic Novelists' Association twice, first for "Foreign Fruit" in 2004 and then for "The Last Letter from Your Lover" in 2011. Her writing has never failed to make it to the bestseller lists across the globe, including the New York Times lists, and has also been a part of the major book clubs like Reese Witherspoon's Hello Sunshine Book Club. Though the commercial success by itself is not sufficient to claim the literary merit, yet the mixture of popularity, acclaim from the critics, and attention from the academy is seen as an indication that Moyes has secured a unique place in the contemporary literary scene.

Conclusion. The assessment of the literary works of Jojo Moyes brings to light the innovative, engaging and at the same time human-like writer's persona who has quite a lot to say in the field of modern literature and English literature, in particular, with her psychological characterization, and cultural dialogues, to name a few. Besides, she was the first to bring about a whole new avenue of dialogues along the lines of euthanasia, disability, and love through popular fiction. Moreover, her continuously exhibiting of female empowerment and sisterhood is not only a mirror of the feminist movement's core issues but also a factor that attracts the average reader's attention.
